No Girl Without 1 in 4 teenagers cannot afford feminine products

Let's take action to end period poverty. Period.



Emplify Health by Bellin is looking to make a difference to end Period Poverty by collecting female hygiene products to distribute to middle and high schools in your area including Marinette, Menominee, Oconto and Forest Counties, WI and Menominee and Dickenson Counties, Ml.

Period Poverty refers to the lack of access to feminine hygiene products that not only affects homeless women, it affects a huge number of schoolchildren as well.

Your area schools are in need of:

- Sanitary Pads and Panty Liners
- Tampons
- Feminine Wash and Body Wash
- Deodorant
- Hygiene Wipes/Flushable Wipes/Baby Wipes
- Reusable Products: Period Panties and Menstrual Cups
- Other Requests: Toothbrushes/Paste, Combs/Brushes, and Shampoo
- Men's Deodorant (many teenage boys also suffer hygiene poverty).



Period Poverty increases anxiety, embarrassment, shame and depression!

Period Poverty increases the risk of infection, dermatitis, and Toxic Shock Syndrome, which is dangerous and can be life threatening.

According to statistics

- 1 in 5 teenagers will skip/miss school during their period.
- There are no state programs offering feminine products. i.e. EBT & WIC (food stamps).
- 51% of teens report they wear products longer than medically suggested.
